Placing files on the web server

The basic subscriber agreement allots each user 25Mb of Storage on the Server. You may use this space for a Personal Web page. You can create a Web Page by placing files in your home directory. You can log into your home directory through ftp. Point your ftp program to ftp.hky.com and use your username and password to log in. The username and password are the same that you use for Email. For example, if your Email address is JohnDoe@hky.com, your username would be JohnDoe. To access the webpage, point your browser to http://users.hky.com/USERNAME. For the example above John Doe would point his browser to http://users.hky.com/JohnDoe. The browser will then automatically load the index file that you placed in the directory.

- You can transfer web pages (html, .jpg, .gif, etc), future updates, and other files using your FTP program into your directory. You may add additional directories inside your home directory if needed.
- Your Web address will then be http://users.hky.com/USERNAME name the main page index.html and, if you request, we will register a domain name for your use. It will also point to your directory.

NOTE:

- Your first file should be index.html
- You will be working on a Unix server. All file names are case sensitive. For
 this reason, a link that may work on your hard drive may not work on the
 server. To avoid this, check to make sure capitalization is consistent for all
 links and file names.
- File names should not contain spaces or the following characters:
 !,@,#,\$,%,^,&,*,(,)
